### 1. Background

One in four young people are affected by conflict and violence, nevertheless, their voices are often disregarded and excluded from formal peacebuilding processes. The meaningful inclusion of young people is key to advancing the commitments of the 2030 Agenda particularly towards peaceful and inclusive societies. Aligned to Security Council Resolution 2250 on Youth, Peace and Security, there is a growing movement to create more spaces and opportunities for young peacebuilders to transform their communities and to chart their own pathways towards sustainable peace.

The Evaluation Offices of UNFPA and UNICEF have co-led a meta-synthesis of more than 120 youth evaluations to extract and synthesize evidence and lessons learned linked to Priority 5 on peace and resilience building of the UN Youth 2030 Strategy. Other partners involved in this exercise include the EvalYouth Global Network, Office of the Secretary-General's Envoy on Youth, DPPA/Peacebuilding Support Office, IOM, UNDP, UNIDO, and UNODC, United Network of Young Peacebuilders, and YOUNGO (UNFCCC constituency of Youth Non-Governmental Organizations). This inter-agency exercise follows the first meta-synthesis on youth evaluations that was conducted in 2020-2021 focusing on youth participation and youth and human rights.

The meta-synthesis report titled 'What works to amplify the rights and voices of youth in peace and resilience building?' serves to inform and guide future youth programming in peace and resilience building and to accelerate the implementation of the UN Youth2030 Strategy.
